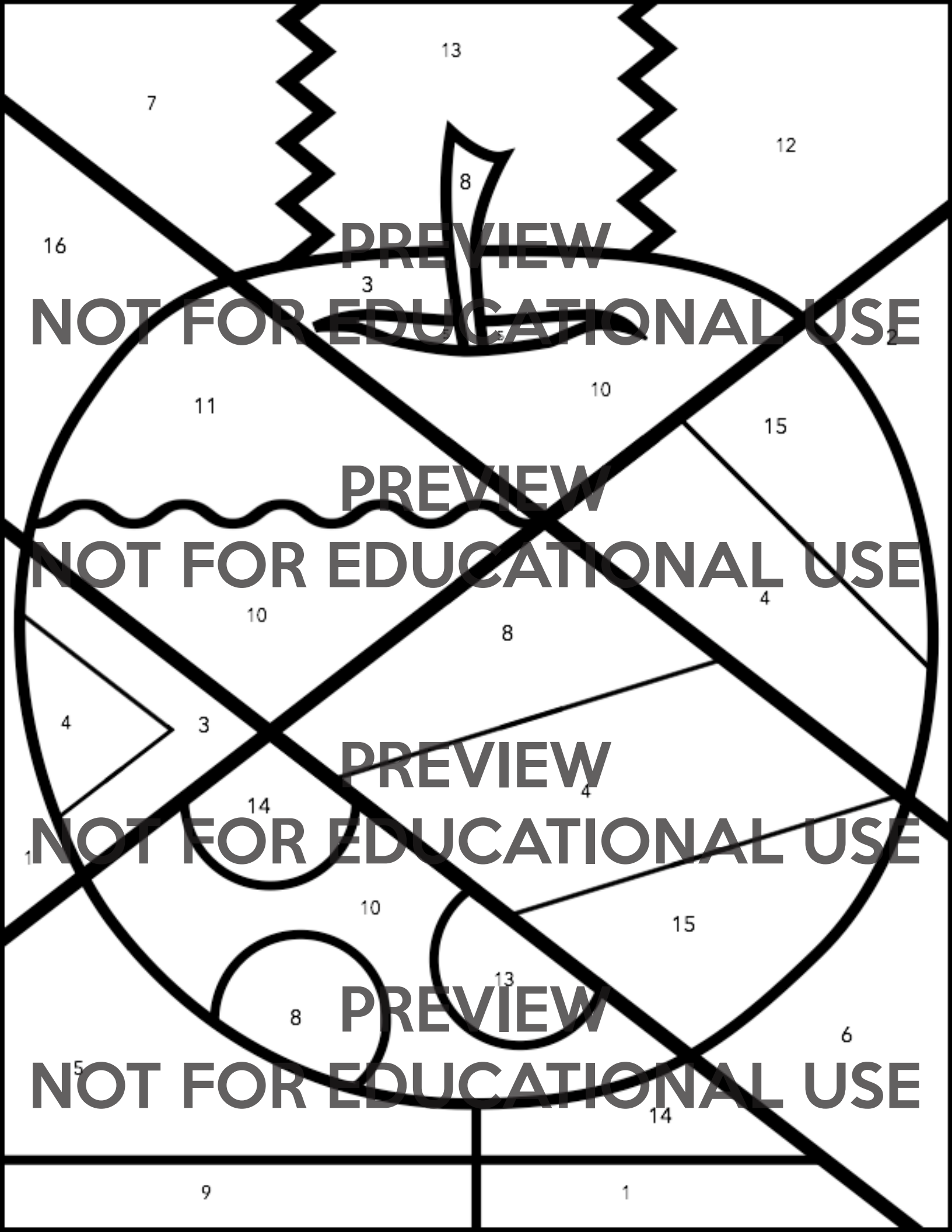


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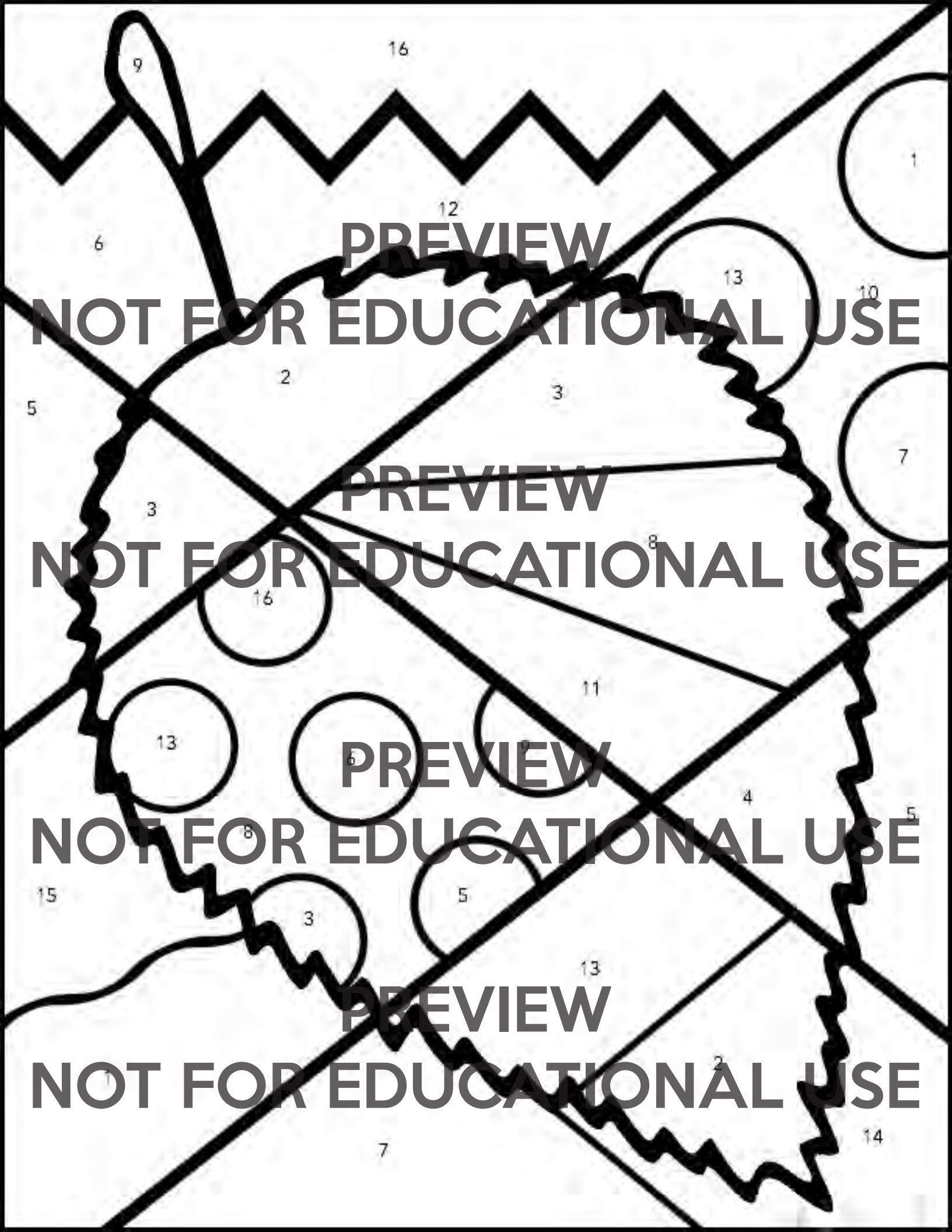
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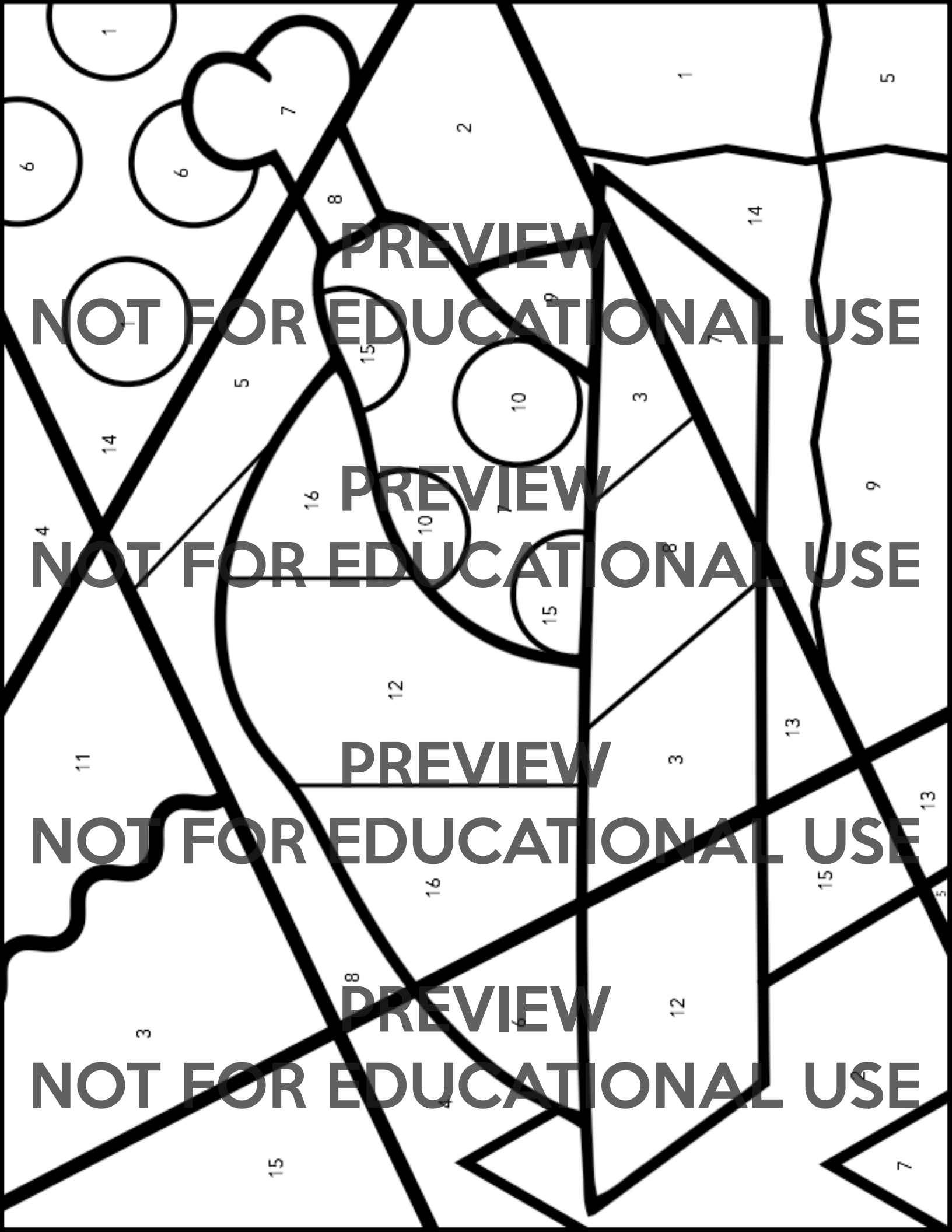
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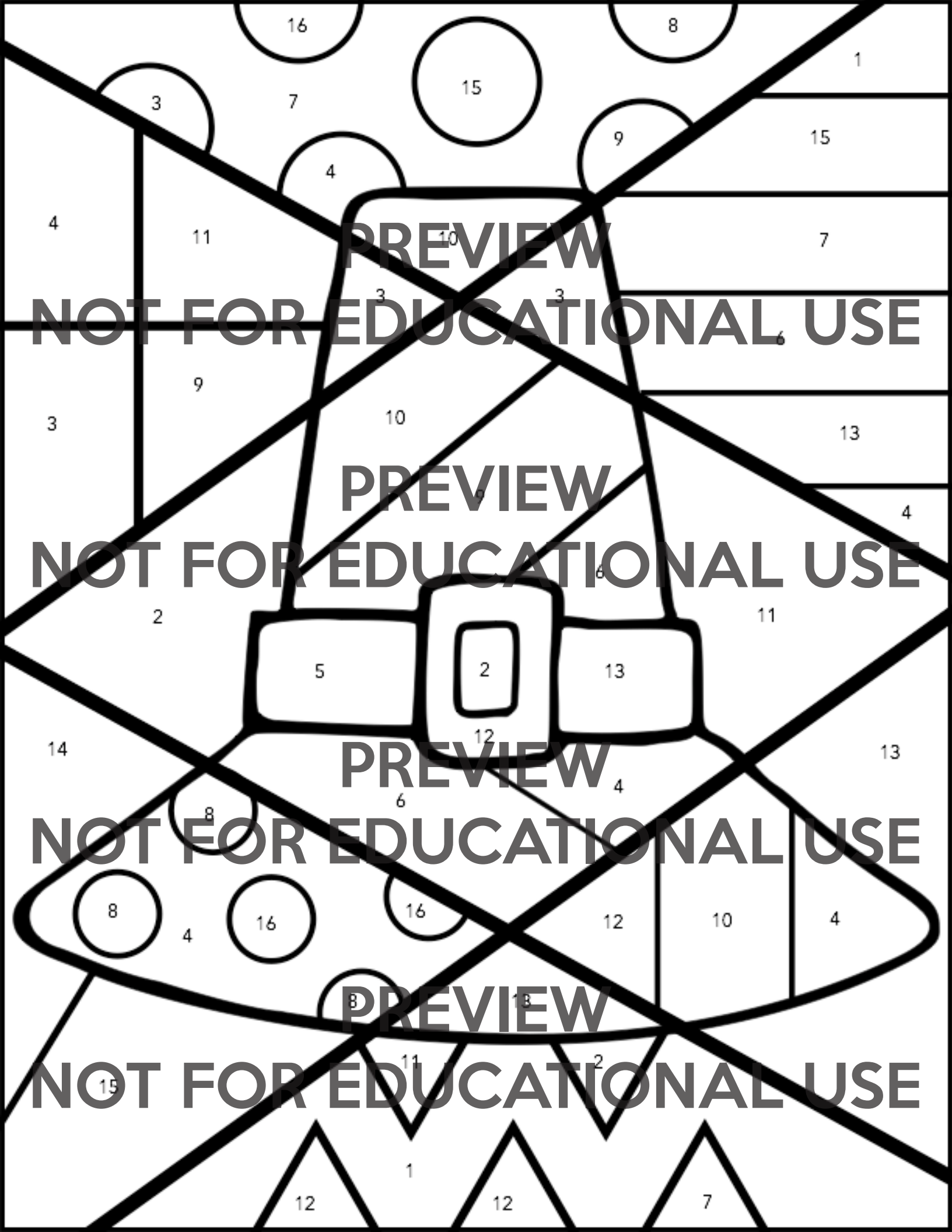


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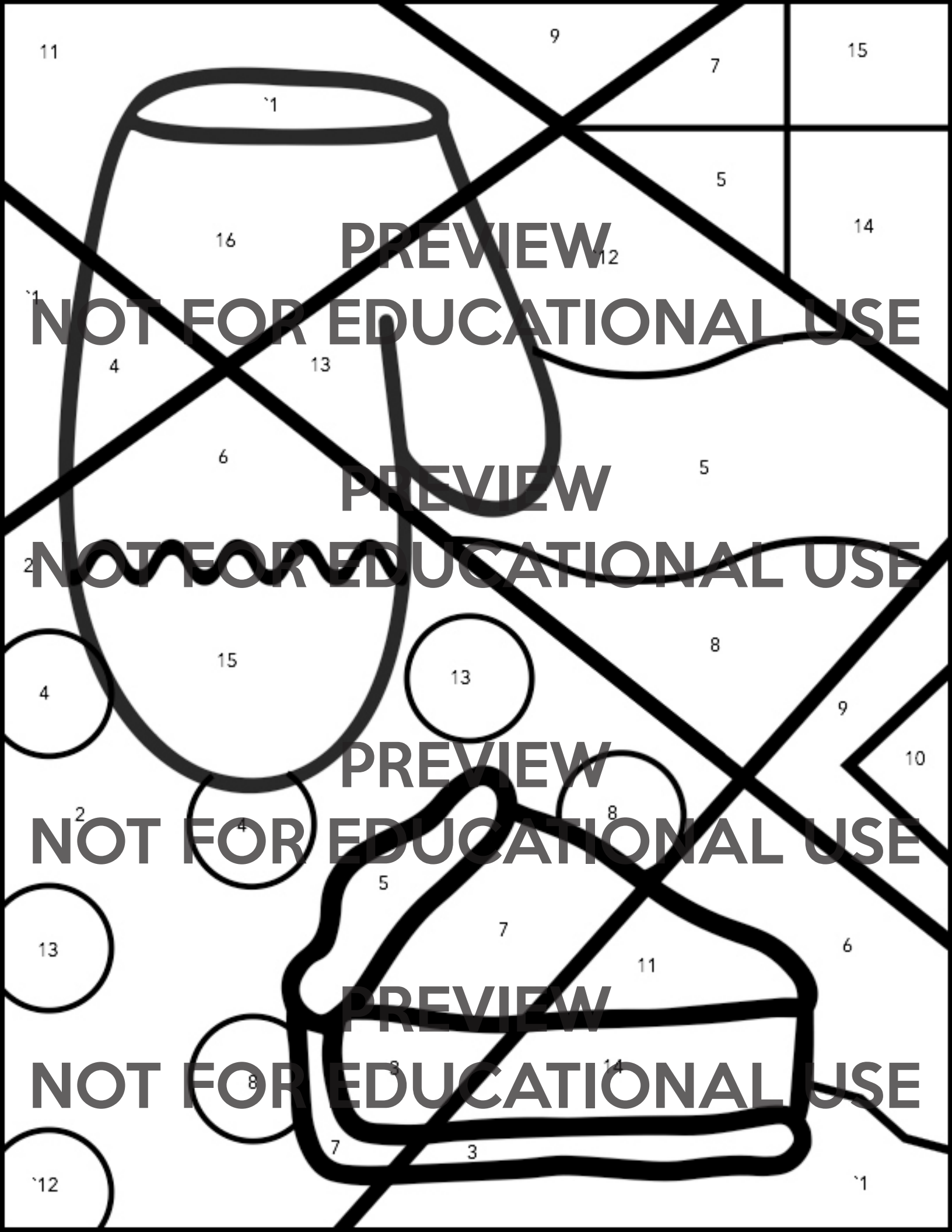
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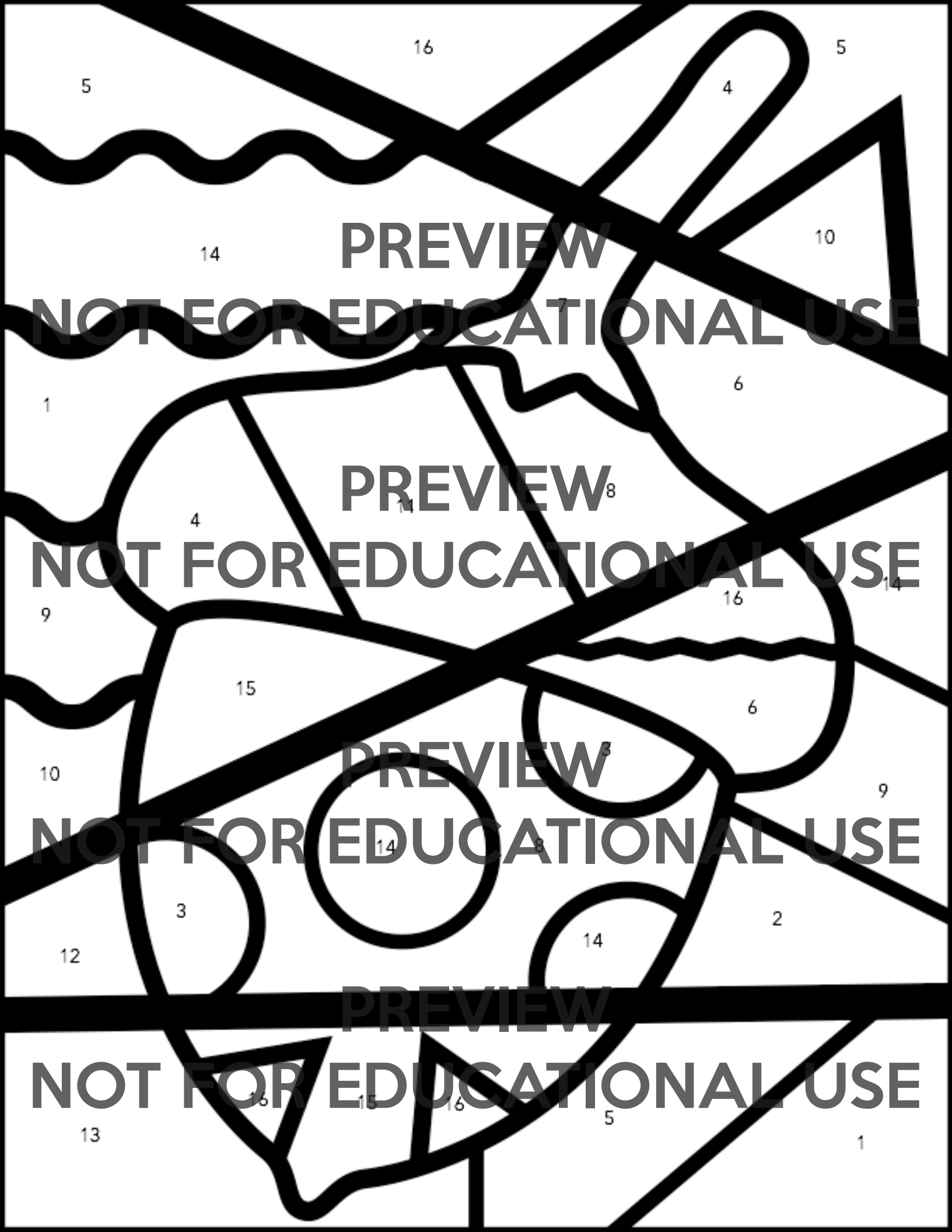
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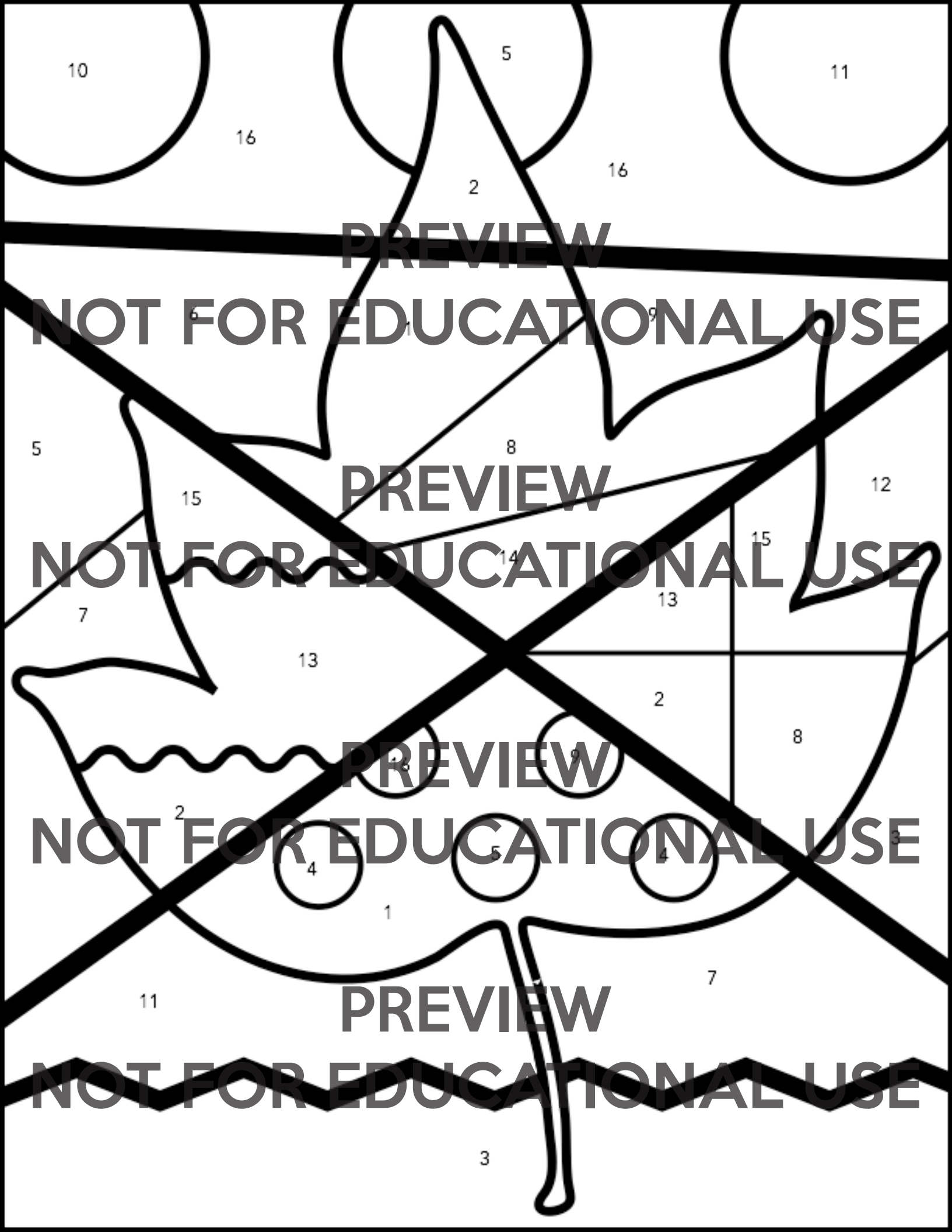
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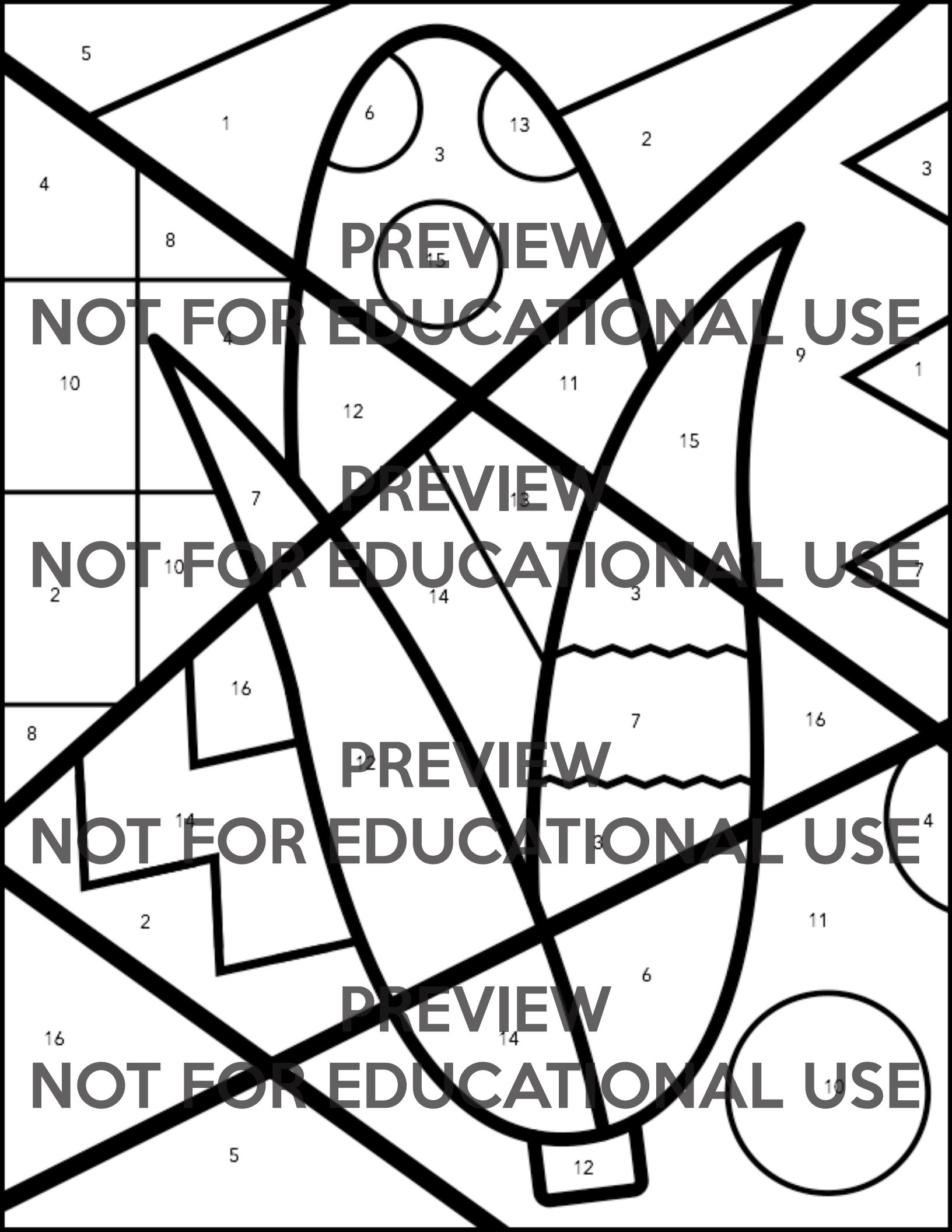
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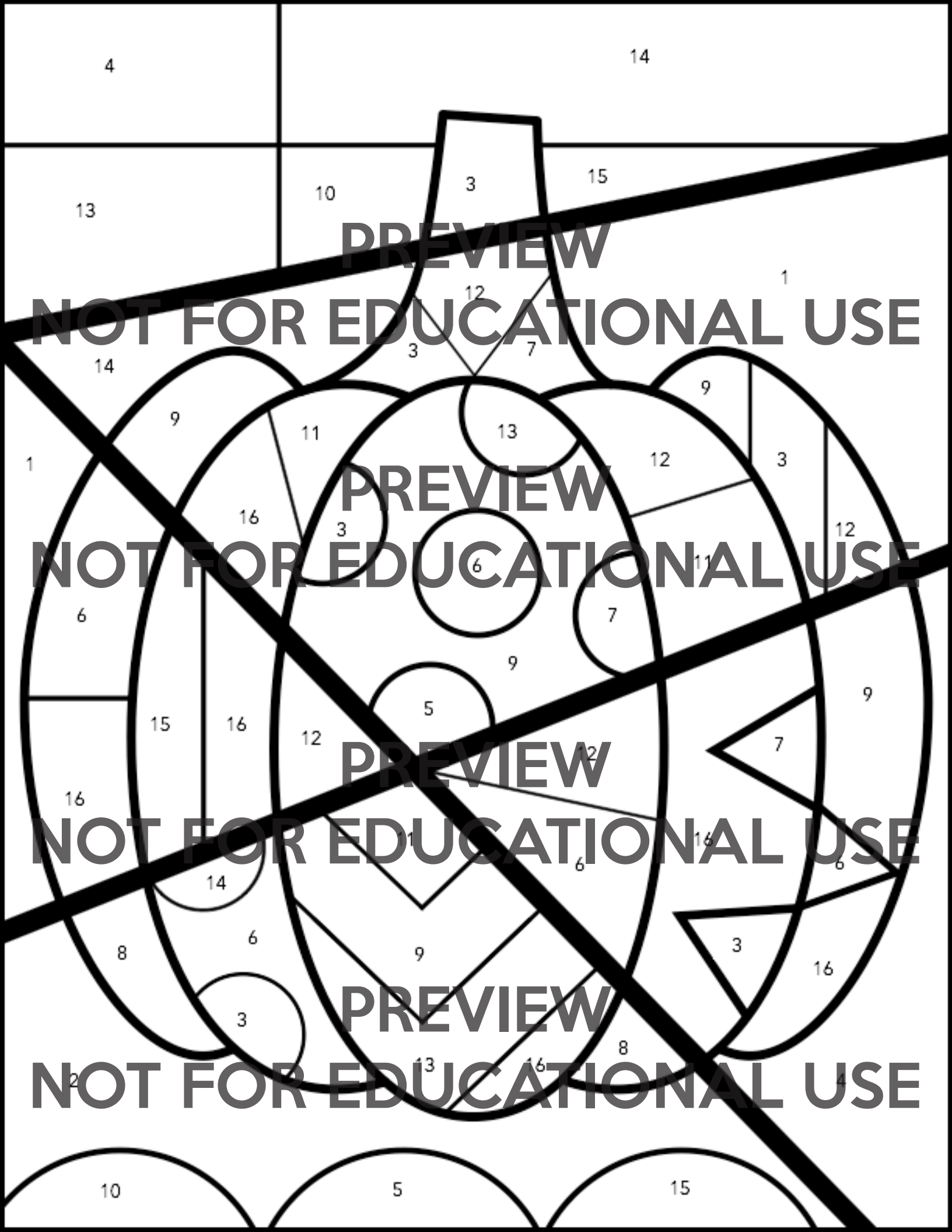


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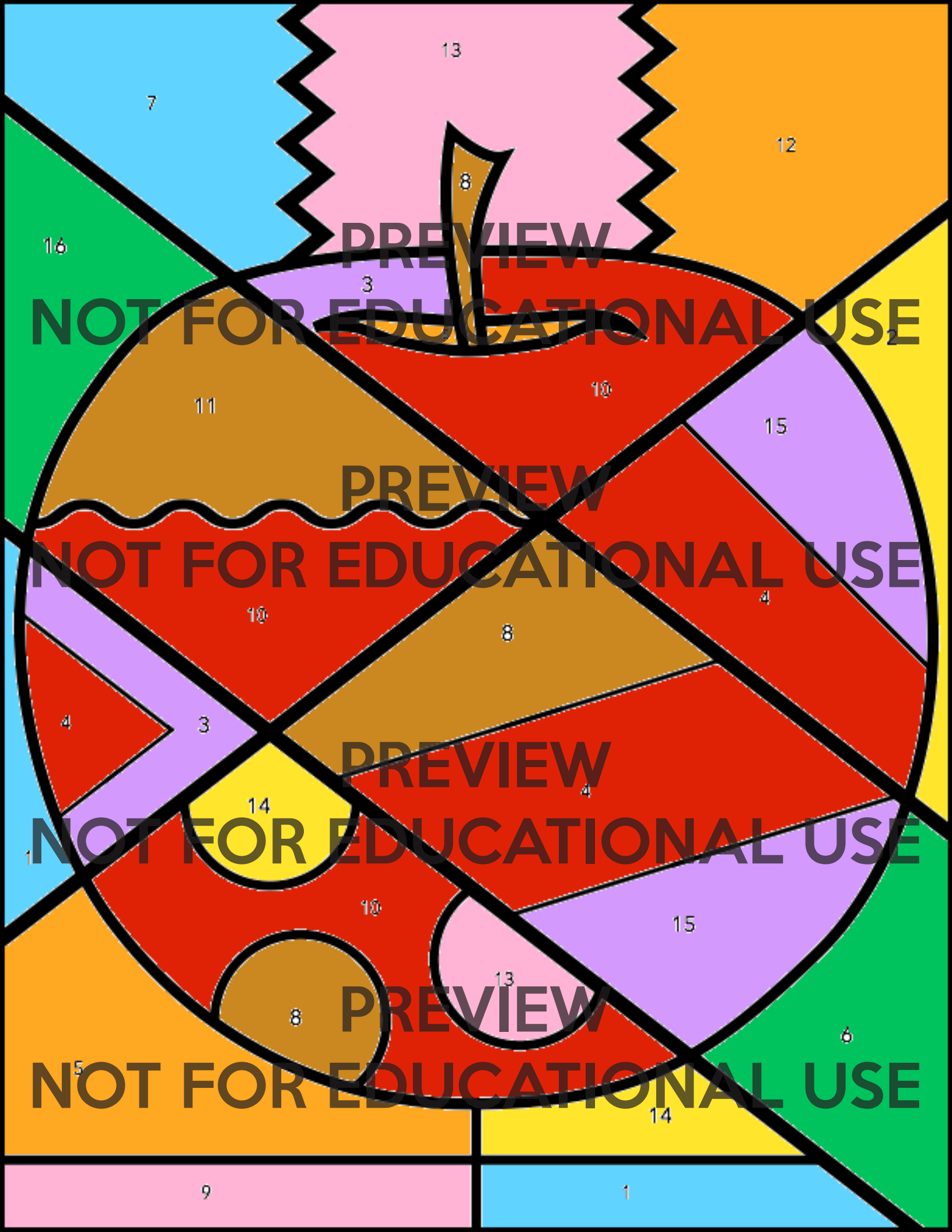
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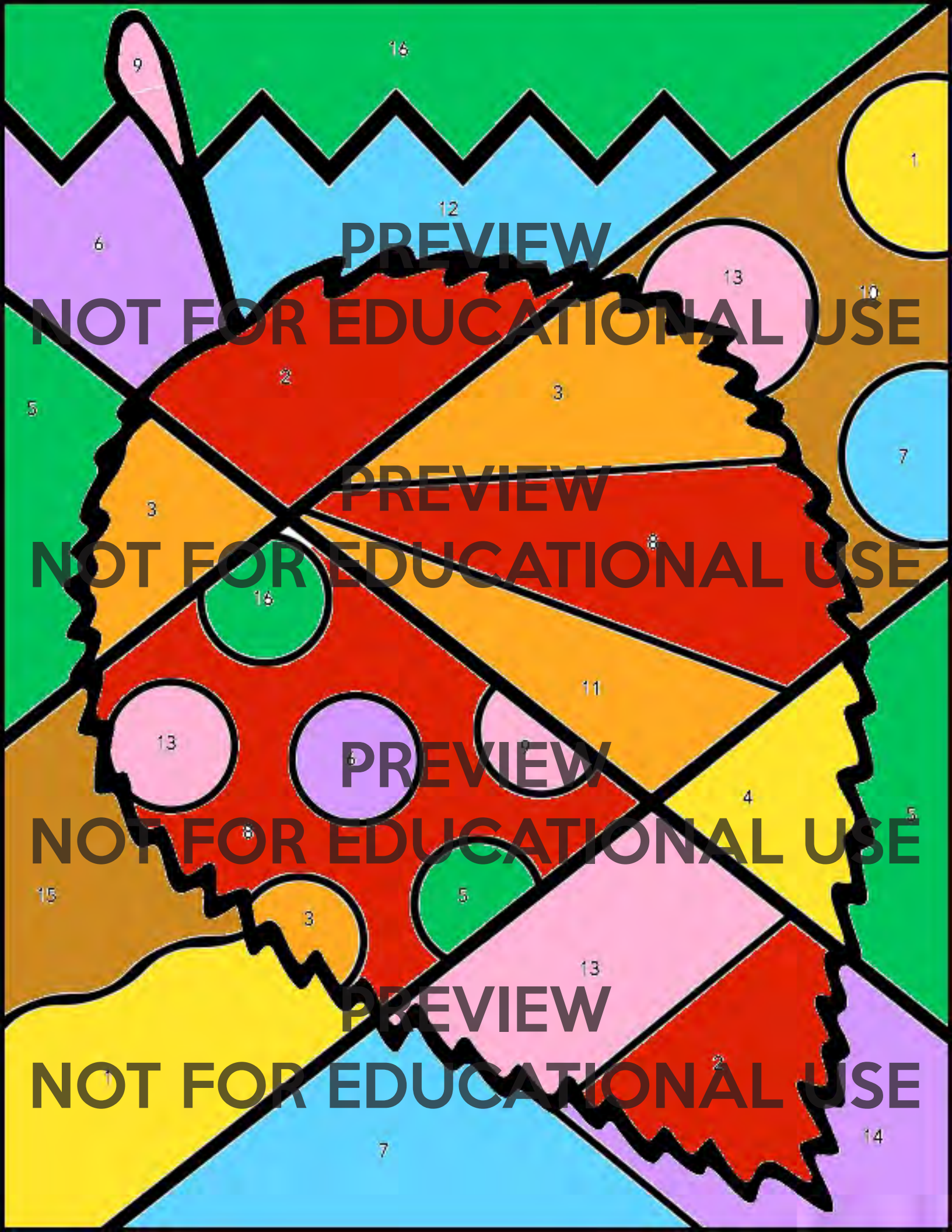
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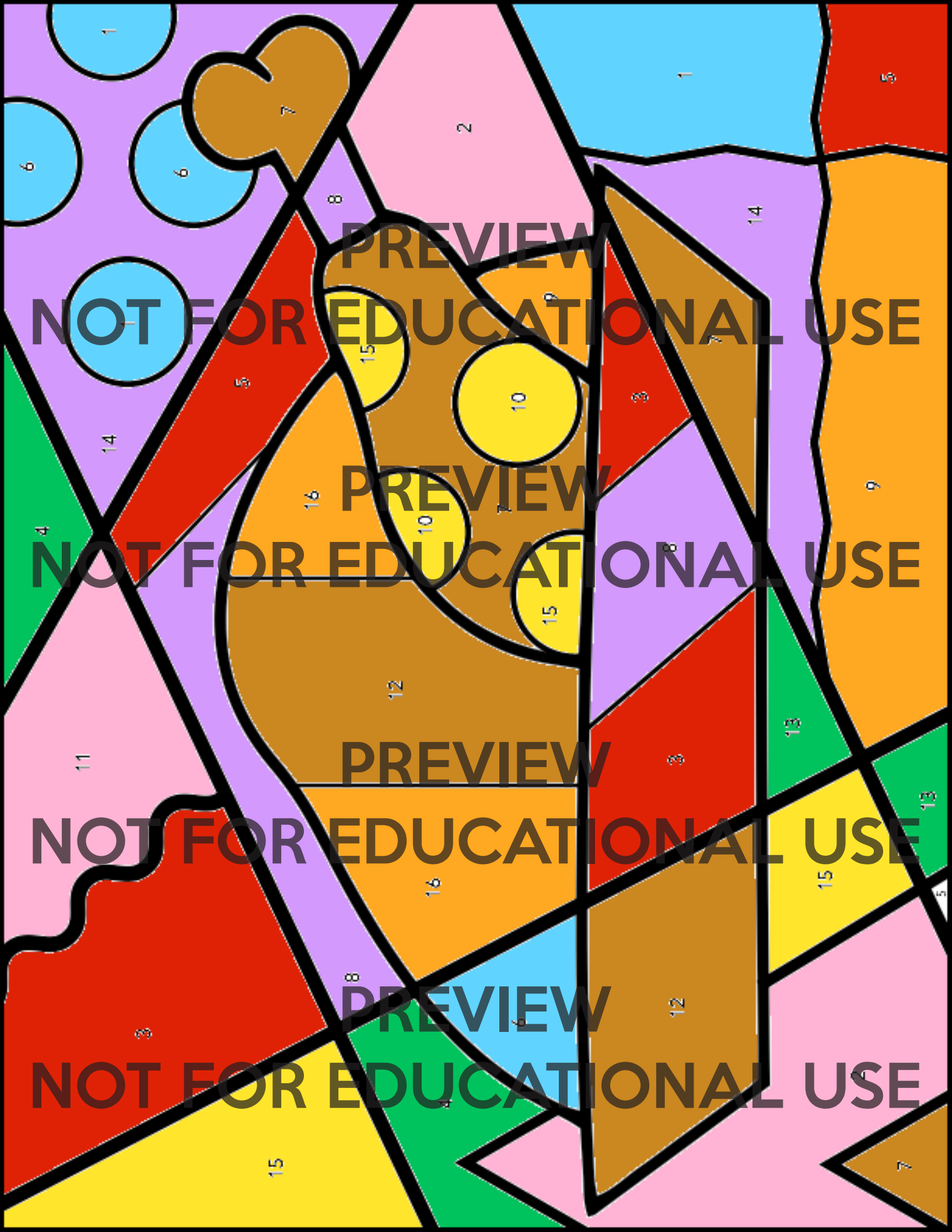
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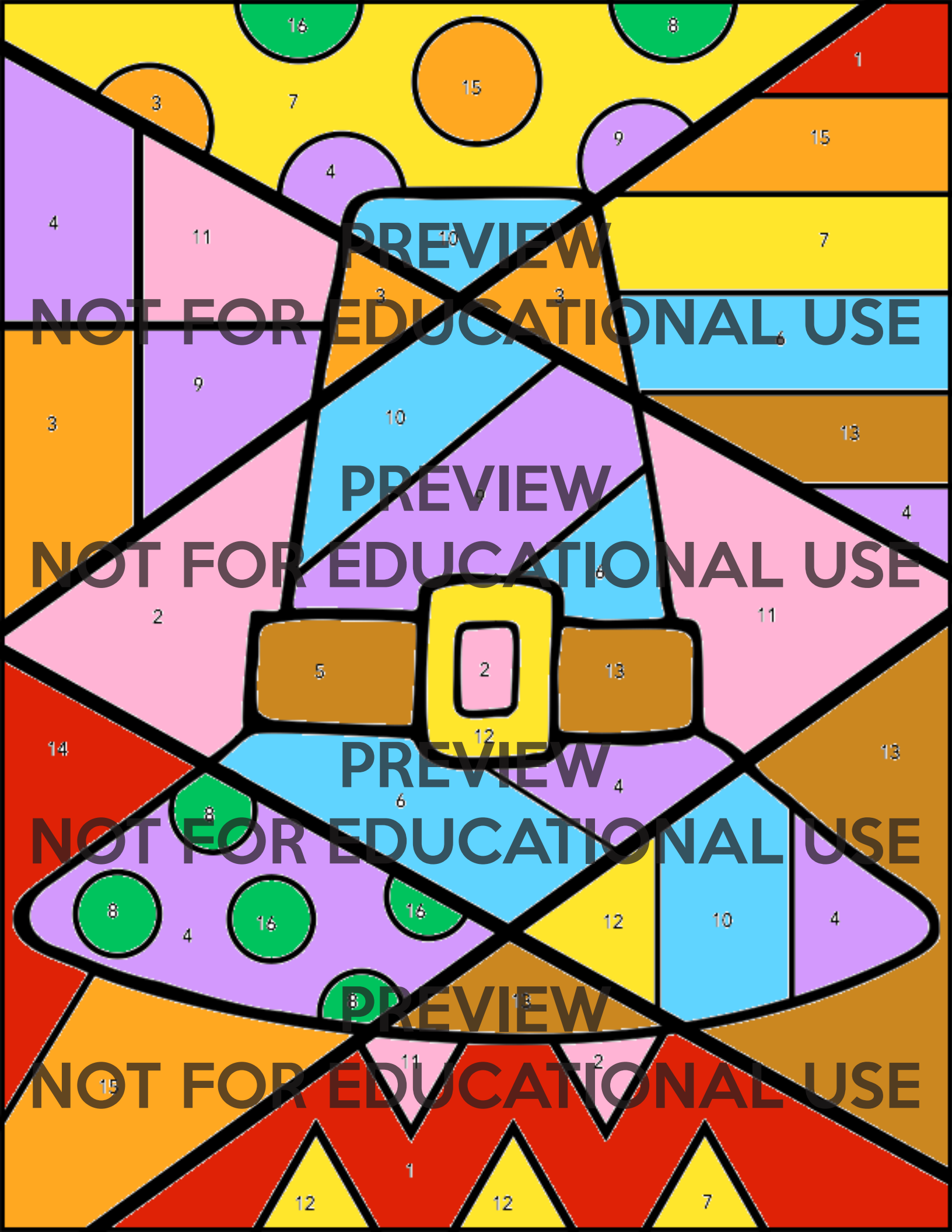
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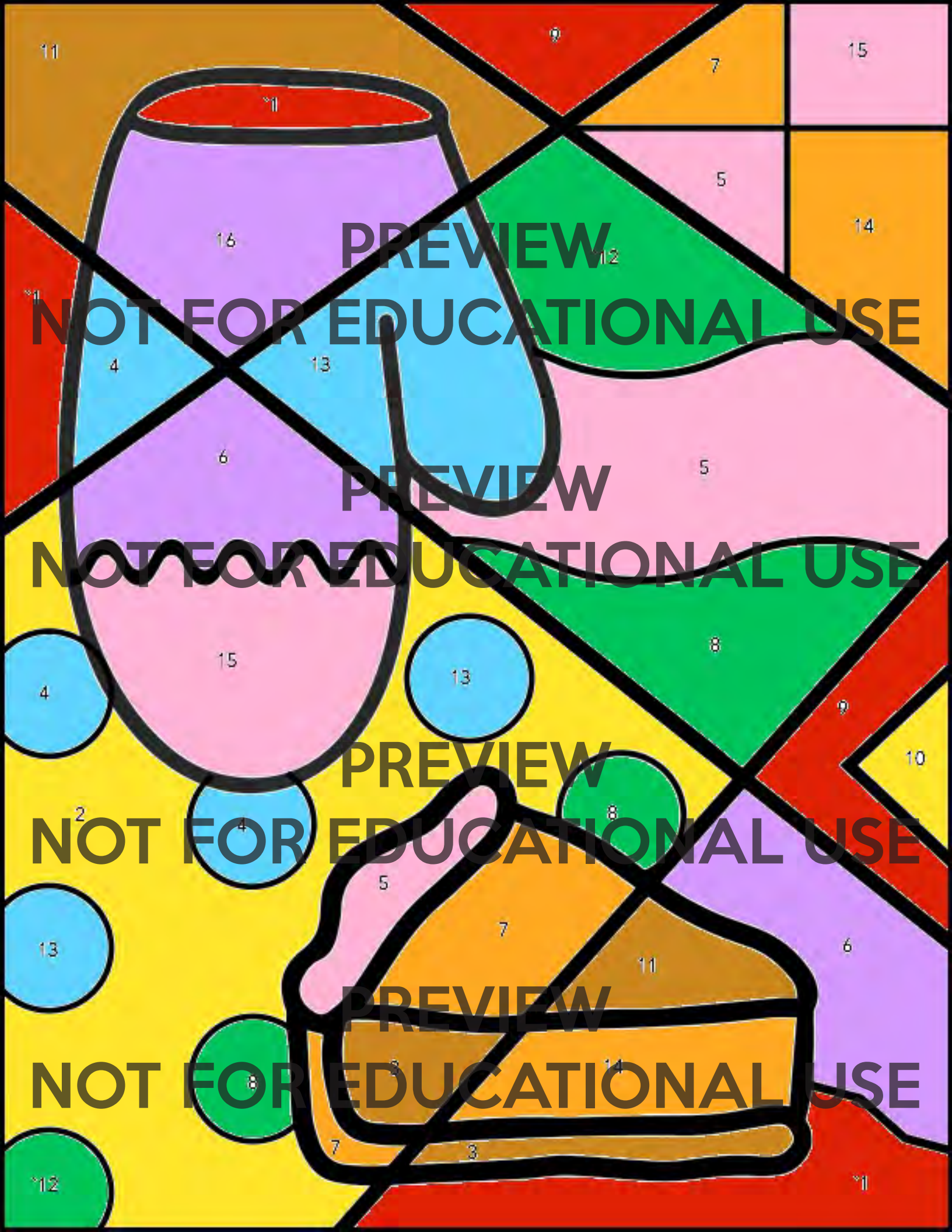
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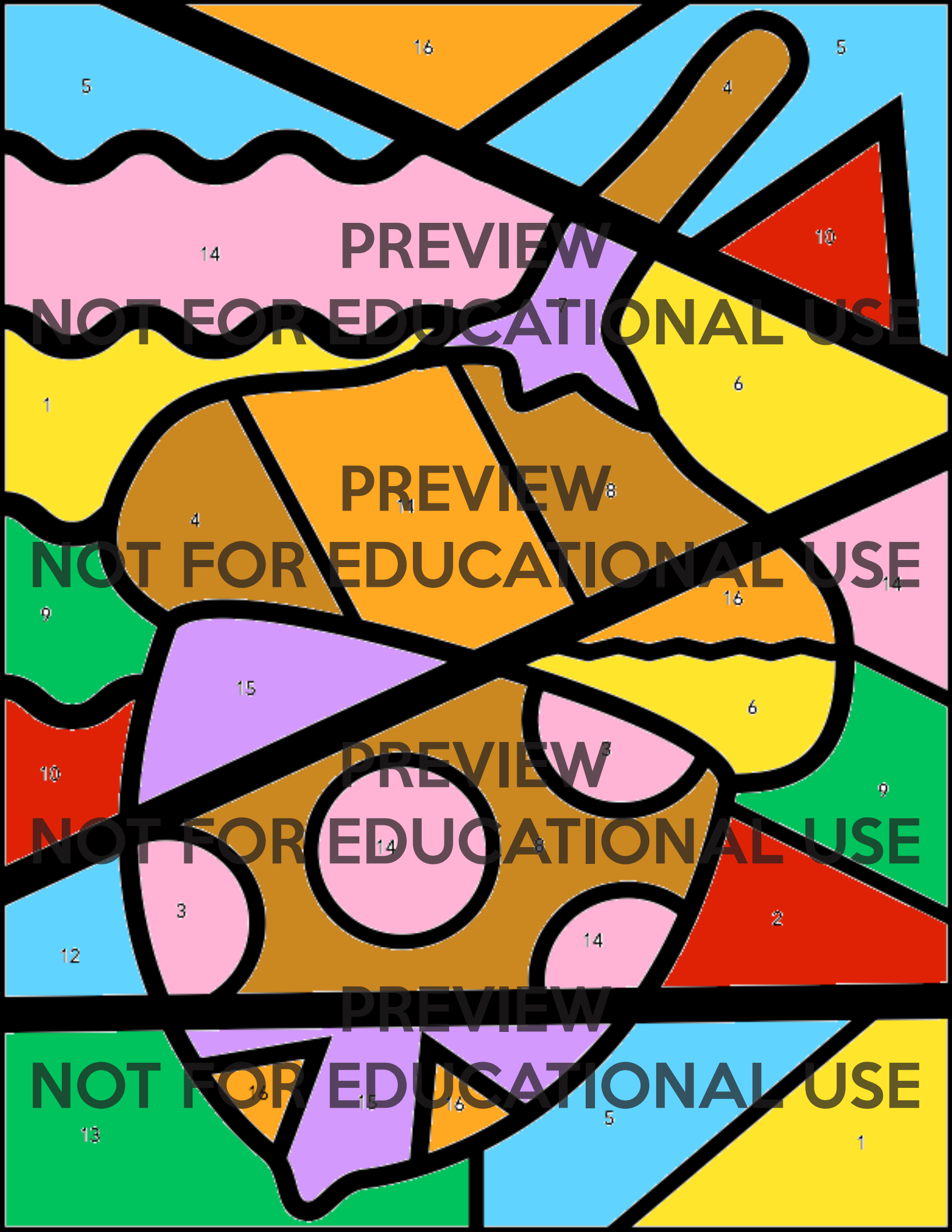


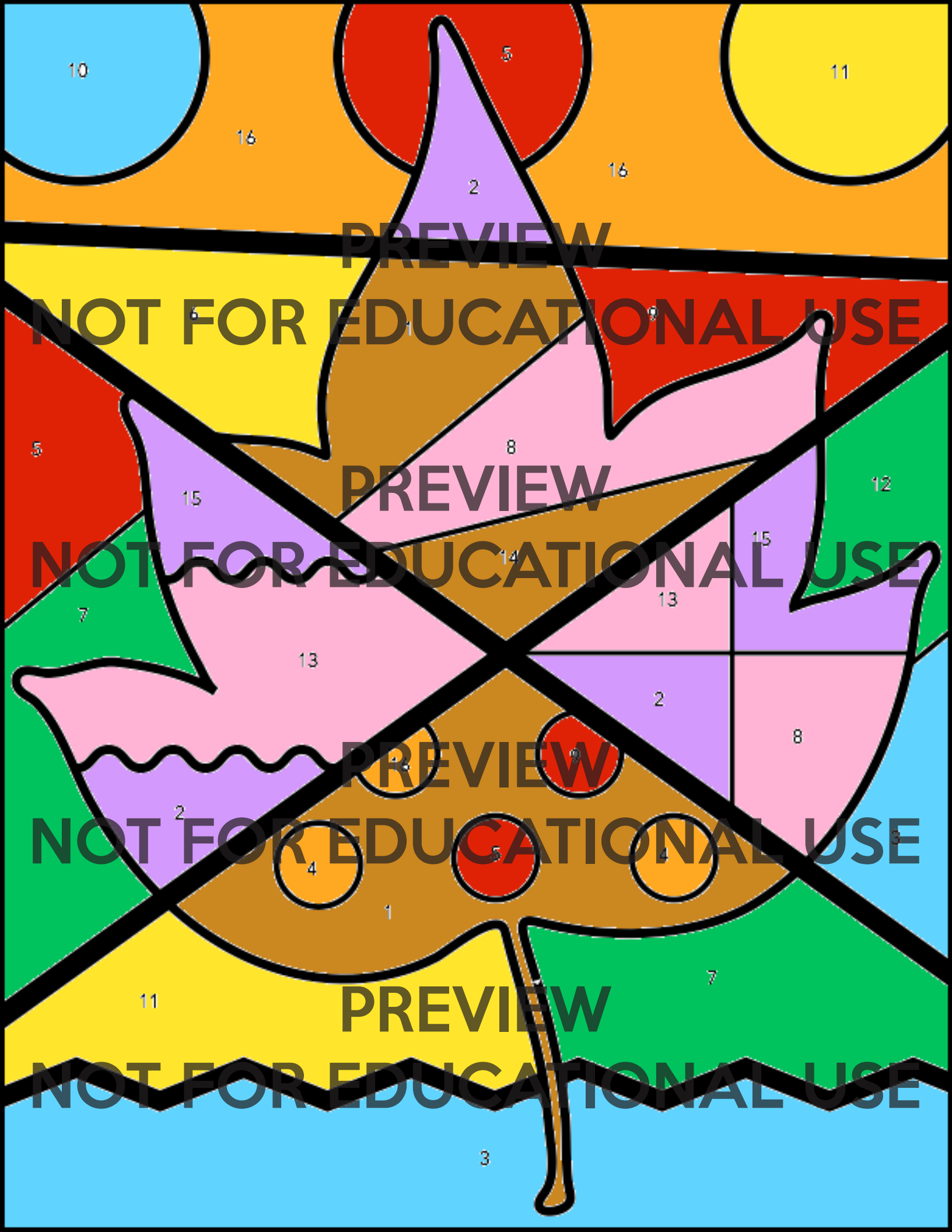












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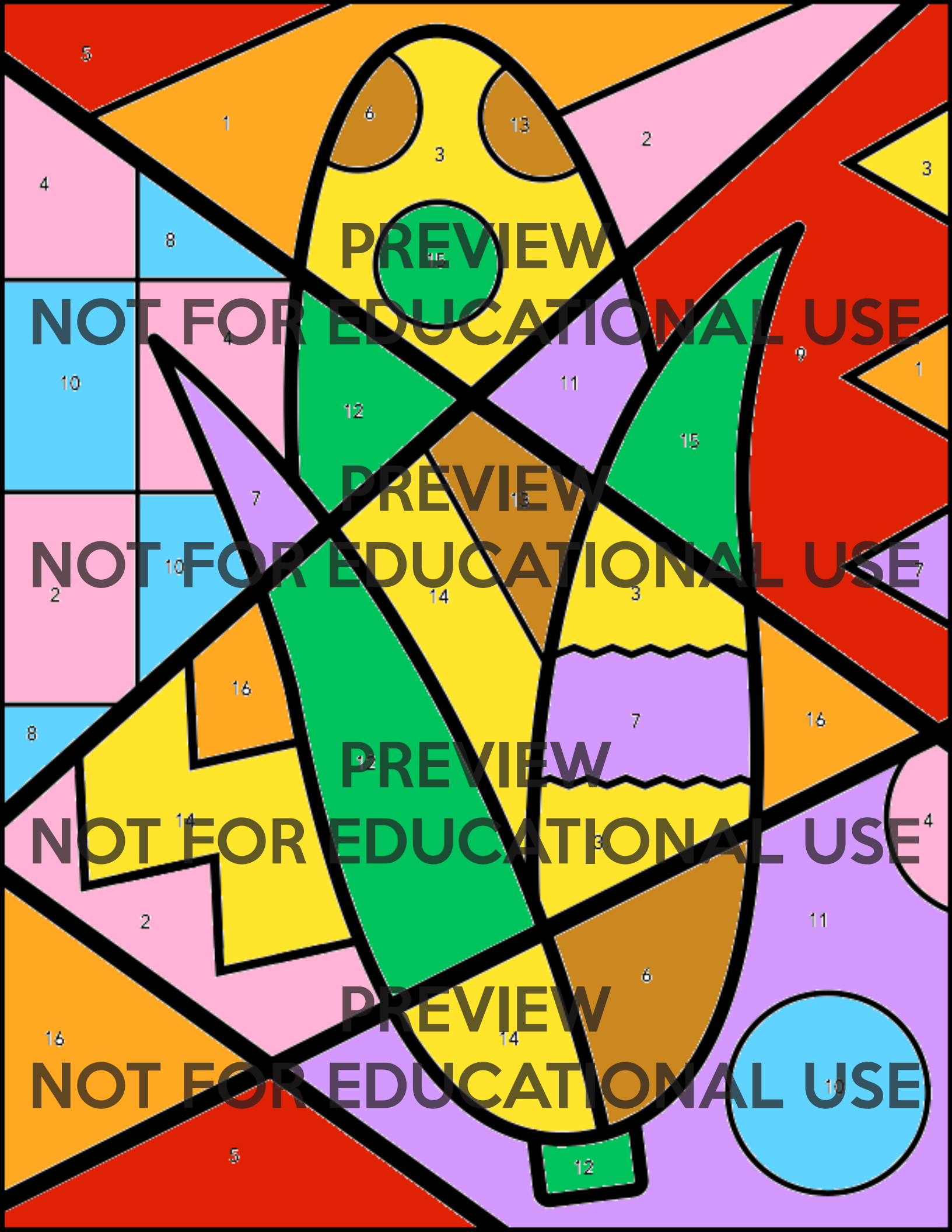
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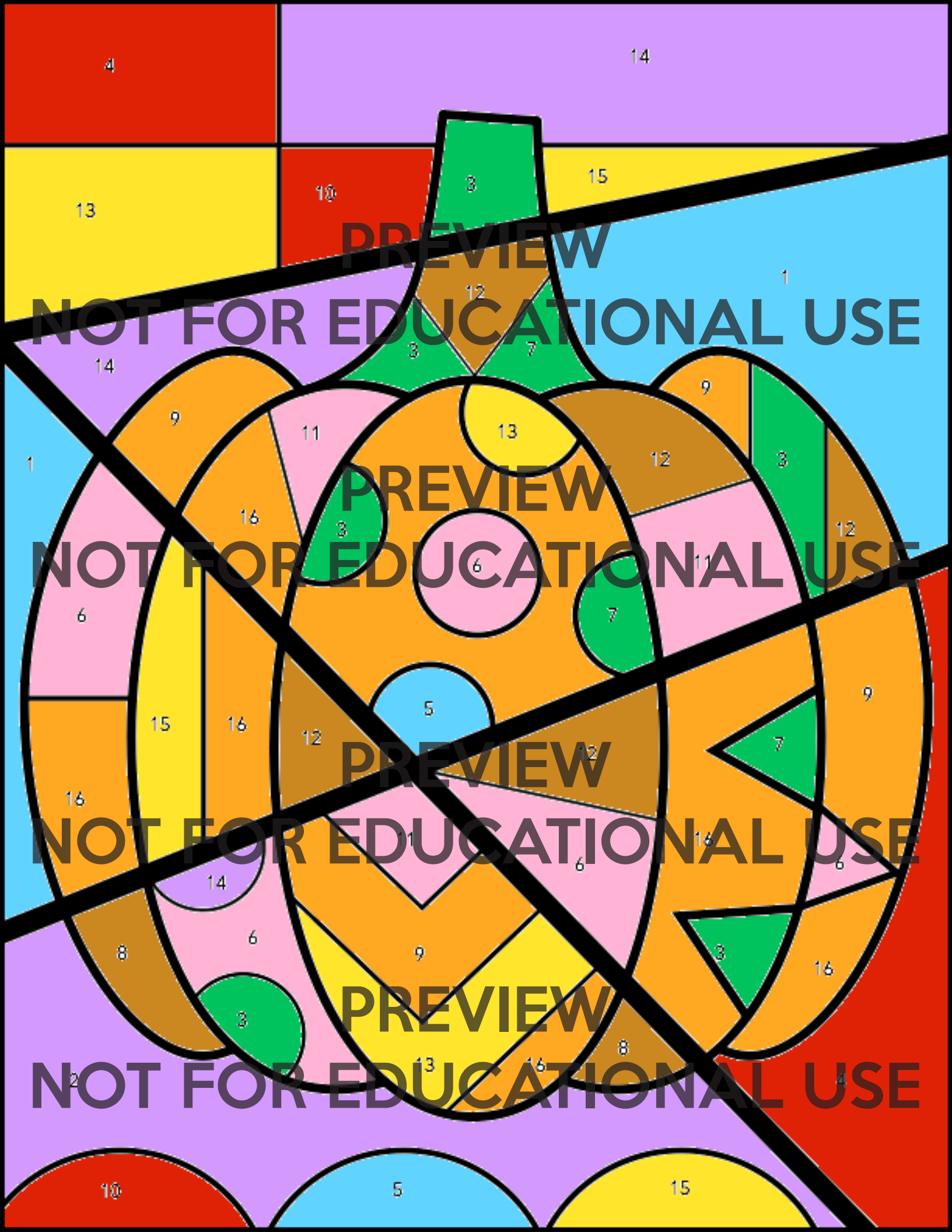
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# Fall & Thanksgiving Coloring Activity

## Parts of Speech

**Learning Objective:** Students will be able to recognize and distinguish nouns, verbs, adverbs, adjectives, pronouns, interjections, conjunctions, and prepositions correctly in sentences.

**Materials Needed:** Print out of coloring pages and coloring guides; crayons, markers, or colored pencils. Colors needed: Red, blue, yellow, orange, green, purple, pink, and brown.

**Level Descriptions:** All levels use the same coloring pages. If you'd like to differentiate instruction for your students based on skill level or grade level, use the coloring guides to do so. The guides are classified as easy, medium, and hard. There are 10 different images for each level. Have students color as many pictures as you'd like! The level guide descriptions are below.

**Color Key Grid (for all levels)**

Noun = Red	Verb = Blue	Pronoun = Pink	Adjective = Orange
Adverb = Yellow	Preposition = Purple	Interjection = Green	Conjunction = Brown

**Easy Guide:** Students will read 16 sentences and identify the parts of speech of the bolded words. Students will choose from TWO answer choices giving them a 1 in 2 chance of answering correctly. Students will then match their answers with the coordinating colors from the color key grid on their worksheet. Students will then locate the corresponding question number on their coloring page and color the spaces on the image with the correct color. For example, if number one's answer is noun, and all nouns are red (see chart above), then all spaces with the number one should be colored red. All eight parts of speech are covered in this activity.

**Medium Guide:** Students will read 16 sentences and identify the parts of speech of the bolded words. Students will choose from FOUR answer choices giving them a 1 in 4 chance of answering correctly. Students will then match their answers with the coordinating colors from the color key grid on their worksheet. Students will then locate the corresponding question number on their coloring page and color the spaces on the image with the correct color. For example, if number one's answer is noun, and all nouns are red (see chart above), then all spaces with the number one should be colored red. All eight parts of speech are covered in this activity.

**Hard Guide:** Students will read 16 sentences and identify the parts of speech of the bolded words. Students will write in the part of speech on the line; they must choose from the eight parts of speech, giving them a 1 in 8 chance of answering correctly. Students will then match their answers with the coordinating colors from the color key grid on their worksheet. Students will then locate the corresponding question number on their coloring page and color the spaces on the image with the correct color. For example, if number one's answer is noun, and all nouns are red (see chart above), then all spaces with the number one should be colored red.

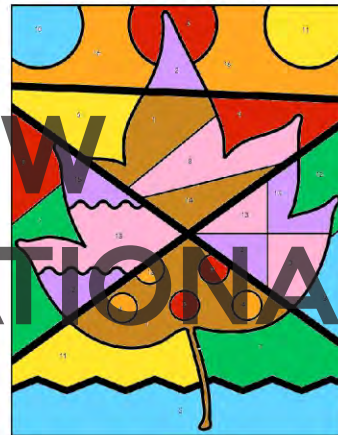

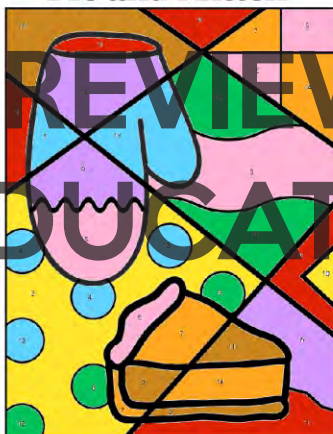
