One Pager Project

A one-pager is a collage of illustrations and written analyses on one page that make up an aesthetically pleasing and detailed interpretation of a subject or piece of literature.

Directions

Share your unique understanding of the text on one page by imaginatively blending your written ideas with colorful images from the story. You should spend at least thirty minutes reading and/or brainstorming ideas before you begin decorating your page. Use a standard size piece of blank paper (8.5 x 11) or you may use a template provided for you.

Below is a list of what should be included on your page:

- Include the title of the short story.
- Include two or more important quotations from the text.
- Include four or more illustrations/graphic images.
- Include a theme and explanation of the theme using textual evidence.
- Include three or more key words that contribute to the main idea of the story.
- Choose two of the following literary elements to incorporate into your project: *point of view, foreshadowing, symbolism, conflict, flashback, mood, tone, irony, characterization, or imagery*. You will analyze the elements as they pertain to the story (do not define what they are in general, but explain how they are part of the story specifically).
- You must fill the entire page.
- Your page must be colored.


CHARACTER ANALYSIS: Charlie is motivated and positive. He wants to increase his intelligence. He shows his motivation by attending night school.


